**Synodal Pathway.** Pope Francis has asked all Catholics to reflect and report on their experience of what it means to be the Church today. Last week I invited you to let me have your thoughts using the open-ended questions on the separate sheets. If you need more time to consider and listen to the Holy Spirit, that is good, but please let me have your thoughts and reflections by the end of the month. The Week of Prayer for Christian Unity begins on Tuesday and goes on until 25th January. This year the theme is 'We Saw His Star in the East'. The story of the Magi visiting the Holy Family in Bethlehem is a very familiar one. The Magi have sometimes been seen as a symbol of the world's diversity – different religions and cultures – that come to pay homage to the Christ-child. The story might therefore represent the unity of all humanity that God desires.

**The Annual Novena** to St. John Bosco begins next Saturday, leading up to his feastday on 31<sup>st</sup> January. Please take a copy of the Novena prayers home with you.

**Sunday of the Word Of God**. Pope Francis has decreed that next Sunday, 23<sup>rd</sup> January, should be "the Sunday of the Word of God". This year's theme is Blessed are those who hear the word of God! (cf. Lk 11: 28). Next Sunday:

- 1 Bring a Bible to Mass to be blessed.
- 2 During Mass that day I shall re-commission and ask God's blessing of our readers, whether they are able to be present physically at the Mass or not.

First Holy Communion Preparation. The Feast of Corpus Christi this year falls on the weekend of 18th/19th June, and that is a good date for the celebration of First Holy Communion. Classes will be in the Don Bosco Centre on Thursday afternoons, starting at 3.30 pm. There will be a meeting for parents on Thursday, 24th February, with the Mass of Enrolment on Sunday, 27th February (the last Sunday before the start of Lent). The classes will start on the Thursday following. If you haven't done so already, please register your children's names with me this week if you would like them to receive Our Lord.

**COVID Regulations.** When you come to church, please consider what keeps you AND others safe.

- Please dress warmly because we have to keep the church well-ventilated
