Feasts in the next couple of weeks. Of course, next Sunday is Christmas Day. Hoorah! When Christmas Day falls on Sunday some adjustments have to be made to the usual calendar: St. Stephen's Day (a day of especial importance for Altar Servers) will be on Monday, 26th December as usual; Friday, 30th December, will be the Feast of the Holy Family; Sunday, 1st January, will be the Solemnity of Mary, the Mother of God; the Epiphany will be on Friday, 6th January; and the Feast of the Baptism of the Lord, which closes the Christmas season, will be on Sunday, 8th January.

Prayers, please. You have probably heard about the events at Babbs Mill Lake in Kingshurst, Birmingham, last Sunday when four children died after they fell through the ice. It was a tragedy for their families and for the whole community, including St. Anthony's Catholic School where one of the children was a pupil. Archbishop Bernard Longley issued a message: "My heart goes out to all those affected by this tragedy and on behalf of the Catholic Archdiocese of Birmingham I offer my deepest condolences to those who have lost loved ones. Our thoughts and prayers are with the Kingshurst community at this deeply distressing time."

Tailpiece: A mother passed on this Christmas message: When my daughters were little I always told them Christmas is Jesus' birthday and that He only received 3 things when He was born, so they shouldn't be disappointed at what they may or may not find under the tree. When it came time for Mass on Christmas morning, I asked the children what they thought Jesus would think of Santa and all the hype. Would He ask Santa a question? My youngest daughter replied, "I think Jesus would ask, "How come I only got three presents and none of them were toys?"
