The Annual Novena to St. John Bosco begins tomorrow (Monday), leading up to his feast day on Wednesday, 31<sup>st</sup> January. Novena prayers are available in the porch. **On the feast of St. John Bosco** there will be Mass here at Our Lady's at 9.15 am, with refreshments in the Don Bosco Centre after Mass.

Holocaust Memorial Day is held on 27th January each year which marks the liberation of Auschwitz-Birkenau, the largest Nazi death camp. It's a time for everyone to pause to remember the millions of people who have been murdered or whose lives were changed beyond recognition during the Holocaust, and in subsequent genocides in Cambodia, Rwanda, Bosnia and Darfur. The theme this year is **Fragility of Freedom**.
