**Welcome to Our Lady Help of Christians for our celebration of Mass. Today we begin Holy Week.**

Holy Week is the greatest week in the Church's year, so please take part as much as you can. *By taking part in the celebrations of the Liturgy we can enter into the events that happened about two thousand years ago. But we enter in, not as bystanders or casual observers but as believers, recognising our own part in what is unfolding, and also recognising the great things that God has done for us.* We can share with Jesus His triumphant entry into Jerusalem on Palm Sunday, His special celebration of the Passover with His disciples at the Last Supper and then His agony and betrayal in the Garden on Maundy Thursday, all the horrible events of Good Friday, His "Sabbath Rest" on Holy Saturday, and thus we can truly share in His Resurrection on Easter Sunday.

**Today is Palm Sunday, the start of Holy Week**

**Wednesday: The Chrism Mass.** The Archbishop will celebrate the Chrism Mass at 11.30 am on Wednesday morning in St. Chad's Cathedral. The Chrism Mass is the occasion when the Holy Oils are blessed. It is also the occasion when the priests of the diocese renew their commitment of service to God and the Church. **Maundy Thursday:** The Mass of the Lord's Supper at 7.00 pm on Maundy Thursday evening is the end of Lent and the start of the Easter Triduum. At this Mass we celebrate the institution of the Sacraments of the Eucharist and the Priesthood.



**Watching at the Altar of Repose.** When the Mass of the Last Supper ends we shall go to the Altar of Repose and keep watch with Jesus, remembering His Agony in the Garden and His acceptance of His Father's will.



**Good Friday:** On Good Friday there is no Mass, but at 3.00 pm in the afternoon, the hour at which our Lord died, there is a "Solemn Celebration" of the Passion of our Lord.

**Holy Saturday:** We do not celebrate Mass on Holy Saturday, the Lord's Day of Rest in the tomb, but in the evening at 8.00 pm we begin our Easter celebrations with the Easter Vigil, the greatest event in the Church's year.



**The Solemnity of the Annunciation.** Because 25<sup>th</sup> March this year falls in Holy Week, the Annunciation will be deferred and will be celebrated after Easter.

**My Day By Day** booklets for Easter are available (£1) at the back of church.

**Easter Flowers.** There will be a retiring collection this weekend towards the cost of the flowers that will adorn our church for the coming celebration of Easter.

**Eucharistic Ministers** will be re-commissioned during the Mass of the Last Supper on Maundy Thursday.

**The collection on Good Friday** is for the Holy Places – i.e. for the upkeep of the sites in the Holy Land associated with the life of Our Lord.

**Traditionally the collection at the Easter Masses** is your personal offering to your priest. There are envelopes at the back of church if you wish. Thank you.

**Welcome to Fr. Martin Flatman.** I am very grateful to Fr. Martin who will be at Sacred Heart on Friday and Saturday, while I am here. On Maundy Thursday I shall be at Sacred Heart and Fr. Martin will be here.

**Easter Triduum.** There is a list on the table at the back of church for people to sign up for various roles at the services of Maundy Thursday, Good Friday, and Holy Saturday. Please don't be shy.

**Opposing the decriminalisation of abortion.** The government's flagship Criminal Justice Bill has two important amendments that could fundamentally change our laws on abortion. You can write to your local MP to make your voice heard on this important issue. (Pre-printed cards are available on the table if you want them).
