On Saturday, 21st September, we shall have an outing to visit the National Memorial Arboretum in Staffordshire. The Arboretum is the UK's year-round centre of Remembrance and home to over 400 symbolic memorials. In a 150-acre site, amongst 25,000 maturing trees, the memorials pay tribute to those who have served our country, including the Armed Forces, civilian and emergency services, and UK charities. There is a visitor centre, events building, two children's play areas, woodland walks, land train tours, buggy tours, exhibitions, restaurant, coffee shop and learning centre. 9.30 am pick up from Sacred Heart and 10.00 am from Our Lady's. Return approx 6.00 pm. Cost: £20. There is a sign-up sheet at the back of the church.

## A new Lectionary with a different translation of the Bible readings will come into use in England and Wales on the First Sunday of Advent, 1st December.

This means that the missals we have been using will no longer have the correct translation and the familiar readings will sound different. This provides all ministers of the Word, clergy and lay alike, with an opportunity to reflect and renew our service. There will be an evening of prayer and preparation for all readers on Friday, 20<sup>th</sup> September, starting with the Holy Hour at 6.00 pm and Mass. After Mass we shall meet in the hall.
