Lent 2025. Lent will begin on Ash Wednesday, 5th March. That's only a few weeks away. It's time to start thinking how we can make this season of grace fruitful.

- If you have any palms from last Palm Sunday that you

 March at the latest, so that we can burn them to make
 ashes for Ash Wednesday.
- During Lent we shall re-start our early morning Mass on Mondays (7.00 am), followed by breakfast in the parish hall. All welcome; it's a good way to start the working week.
- For the Jubilee Year there will be a walking pilgrimage to Blessed Dominic Barberi, our nearest Jubilee Church, with a Lenten Retreat Day/reflection while we are there. More details to follow.
- There is a new resource available for this Jubilee Year. We Dare to Hope is for small group faith-sharing and for individual meditation, featuring five sessions on the jubilee theme of Christian Hope. Each session includes scripture, prayers, and a reflection with questions. I should like to run this in the parish hall on Monday evenings in Lent, at 7.00 pm. Everyone is welcome to join in. A message from Fr. Craig, the Diocesan Vocations Director. "In recent months a number of young men under the age of 18 have been in touch with me to ask about how they can discern a vocation to the priesthood.
