- 1. **Stations of the Cross.** Each Friday, after Mass.
- 2. **Prayer before the Blessed Sacrament,** Fridays, 6.00–7.00 pm, with the opportunity for Confession.
- 3. **Walk With Me** booklets are available, with Lent calendars. They are an aid to prayer and reflection.
- 4. Parish Penance Service. Friday, 4th April, 6.00 pm.
- 5. **Early morning Mass** on Mondays (7.00 am), followed by breakfast in the parish hall.
- 6. A walking pilgrimage to Blessed Dominic Barberi, our nearest Jubilee church, with a Lenten Retreat Day/reflection. Saturday, 29th March. Leave Our Lady's at 10.00 am. - 7. **We Dare to Hope**. In the parish hall on Monday evenings, at 7.00 pm, starting this Monday. We can explore the jubilee theme of Christian Hope through scripture, prayers and a reflection with questions. Everyone is welcome to join in.
- 8. The statues in the church will be veiled from the 5th Sunday of Lent (Passion Sunday) until Holy Saturday.
- 9. During Lent we do not have flowers in church, and we do not say the Gloria during Mass on Sundays, nor the joyful word "A*****A!" We shall save it all up and let rip at the Easter Vigil.

Tailpiece: One Sunday the regular church organist was sick and a substitute had been brought in at the last minute. He asked the Parish Priest what he should play. The priest was a bit rushed and said, "Here's the order of Mass, but you'll have to think of something to play after I do the announcements." During the service, the priest paused and said, "Brothers and Sisters, we are in great difficulty; the roof repairs cost twice as much as we expected and we need £4,000 more.
